

OVERVIEW

The **United Republic of Tanzania** (Swahili: *Jamhuri ya Muungano wa Tanzania*) is a sovereign state in Eastern Africa within the African Great Lakes region. It borders Kenya and Uganda to the north; Rwanda, Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo to the west; Zambia, Malawi, and Mozambique to the south; and the Indian Ocean to the east.

Tanzania is mountainous and densely forested in the north-east, where Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest point in Africa is located. Three of Africa's Great Lakes are partly within Tanzania. To the north and west lies Lake Victoria (Africa's largest lake and source of the Nile River) and Lake Tanganyika (the continent's deepest lake) known for its unique species of fish. The Eastern shore is hot and humid, with the Zanzibar Archipelago just 90 kms away. The Kalambo waterfalls in the south-western region of Rukwa are the second highest uninterrupted falls in Africa and are located near the south-eastern shore of Lake -Tanganyika on the border of Zambia. The Menai Bay Conservation Area is Zanzibar's largest marine protected area.

Over 100 different languages are spoken in Tanzania, making it the most linguistically diverse country in East Africa. She does not have a *de jure* official language, although the national language is Swahili.

Tanzania, a country that holds a great history by having played part in independence of many other African countries. HEALTH CARE SYSTEM

Health care in Tanzania is available depending on one's income and accessibility. People in urban areas have better access to private and public medical facilities. Insurance has only in recent years been introduced where as pension schemes have been around longer but the limitations of either are vast and not attending to the needs of majority of Tanzanians.

MEDICAL EDUCATION

The medical course offered in Tanzania is a 5 years doctor of medicine degree course where the first 2 years are of basic medical related studies(anatomy, biochemistry, physiology, pathology, parasitology, etc) and the later 3 years of preclinical and clinical practice.

TRANSPORTATION

Transport in Tanzania includes road, rail, air and water networks. The road network is 86,472 kilometres (53,731 mi) long, of which 12,786 kilometres (7,945 mi) is classified as <u>trunk road</u> and 21,105 kilometres (13,114 mi) as regional road. The rail network consists of 3,682 kilometres (2,288 mi) of track. <u>Commuter rail</u> service is in <u>Dar es Salaam</u> only. There are 28 airports, with <u>Julius Nyerere International</u> being the largest and the busiest. Ferries connect Mainland Tanzania with the islands of Zanzibar. Several other ferries are active on the countries' rivers and lakes.

SOCIAL PROGRAM
